FALL PLANS

We have not yet received guidance from the state about what type of learning will be allowed or expected at the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year, however, it is likely to be one of three options:

- a continuation of distance learning
- in-person, physically distanced, COVID compliant learning
- a hybrid of distance learning and in-person learning

Based on conversations with our Governor, we feel strongly we will return next fall with either physically distanced in-person learning or a hybrid distance learning/in-person socially distanced learning environment. However, real-time health data will guide this decision.
